



development of the Integrated Collaboration Framework, a powerful tool specifically designed to
address the unique challenges faced by women aged 18-35 in accessing vocational training and

Community Activities Across Regions



SPAIN: In Spain, the Momentum project organized two community activities. The first event included roundtable discussions with migrant women who have established themselves in Cantabria and are involved in entrepreneurial projects. The second event showcased various female entrepreneurship projects, ranging from party organization to beauty decorations, soap handicrafts, sewing, and weaving. The activities also featured a musical performance and fostered cultural exchange among the attendees.

ITALY: Italy organized three community events to involve a significant number of women. The first event, held at the headquarters of 'Nuovi Orizzonti,' provided an opportunity for women to understand the proposed course. The second event took place at the city's employment center, fostering dialogue with women in contact with third-sector organizations. The third event familiarized women with the venue where the course would be held, creating a sense of connection and comfort.





HUNGARY: Hungary hosted two community events in partnership with Menedék and MIRA, local organizations for migrants. The Beauty and Community Lounge event featured professional makeup artists, henna artists, and hairdressers with migrant backgrounds, many of whom had already started their own businesses. The second event invited women from various backgrounds to share their culture through costumes, food, songs, poems, and languages, creating a vibrant exchange of experiences and traditions.

GREECE: In Greece, the Momentum project celebrated International Women's Day with inspiring speeches and creative activities to engage and inform women about the project. On March 17th, a major community activity took place, offering jewelry-making and knitting workshops. Women had the opportunity to learn from experienced Greek jewelry makers and share their knitting skills, fostering collaboration and creating handmade products. The activities were held at ActionAid's community center in Athens, promoting a sense of empowerment and cultural exchange.

PORTUGAL: In Portugal, Impact Hub Lisbon organized a community event to celebrate diversity and provide a welcoming environment for migrant and refugee women. The event featured informative sessions, including partners sharing their expertise and experiences. It also included a Bollywood workshop, a shared lunch, and a performance by an Oriental Arab singer. The event showcased the empowerment program scheduled to begin in July, generating enthusiasm among participants and reinforcing the commitment to support and empower migrant and refugee women in creating an inclusive society.
